


Jesus speaks to the Father, expressing His deep concerns for His disciples. His words resonate through time, offering guidance and solace to those who seek to follow Him. Jesus begins by acknowledging His imminent departure from the physical realm, but in the same breath, He reveals His desire for His disciples' protection. He prays to the Father, asking Him to guard His disciples with the power of His name, so they may be united in purpose and protected from the forces of division and discord. The unity that Jesus prays for is not merely superficial or circumstantial. It is a unity rooted in the truth of God's Word, a unity that differences transcends and disagreements. It is a unity grounded in love, the same love that binds the Father and the Son. This unity is not passive; it requires active participation and commitment from His disciples. We are reminded of the challenges we face in our own lives and communities. The world around us is often marked by division, strife, and uncertainty. Yet, in the midst of this turmoil, Jesus offers us a pathway to peace and unity. Jesus knew that His disciples would face opposition and persecution in the world. He prayed not that they would be removed from these trials but that they would be protected from the evil one. This is a powerful reminder that, as followers of Christ, we are not immune to suffering, but we are promised His presence and protection in the midst of it.



Jesus praved for the sanctification of His disciples. He recognised the importance of their continued growth and transformation in faith. This sanctification is a lifelong process, marked by surrender and obedience to God's will. This Gospel offers us a profound insight into the heart of Jesus and His relationship with the Father. It challenges us to pursue unity, seek protection in the face of adversity, and embrace the process of sanctification. May we heed these words and strive to live as faithful disciples, grounded in the love and truth of Christ.

MONTH OF MARY The month of May is a time when the people of God express with intensity their love and devotion for the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is traditional in this month to pray the Rosary at home within the family. May is dedicated in a special way to honouring and seeking the intercession of Mary as the mother of God and Mother of the Church. This month of May which the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady, and it is the occasion for a "moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world pay to the Queen of Heaven. Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance. The Rosary will be said after the 10.00am Mass Monday-Saturday in the month of May.

WORLD COMMUNICATION DAY Sunday 12th May The Pope's message follows the theme Artificial Intelligence and the Wisdom of the Heart: Towards a Fully Human Communication. The development of systems of artificial intelligence, to which I devoted my recent Message for the World Day of Peace, is radically affecting the world of information and communication, and through it, certain foundations of life in society. changes everyone, These affect not merely professionals in those fields. The rapid spread of astonishing innovations, whose workings and potential are beyond the ability of most of us to understand and appreciate, has proven both exciting and disorienting. This leads inevitably to deeper questions about the nature of human beings, our distinctiveness, and the future of the species homo sapiens in the age of artificial intelligence. How can we remain fully human and guide this cultural transformation to serve a good purpose? There will be a second collection this week after every mass.
